



Be Careful What You Wish For!

My first Pumi! A fluffy little white ball of energy that I named "Phoenix." I have owned and trained many dogs in my life, most recently a line of Bernese Mountain Dogs that have been active in agility, obedience, drafting and herding.

As I approached retirement from my job as a large animal veterinarian, I wanted to try something different (and more portable) so that I could expand my knowledge and skills in training and handling.

At first, all went well. Phoenix and my 4-year-old female Bernese Mountain Dog (Berner), Arya, went through protected introductions smoothly and soon became great playmates. Phoenix was pushy, as most puppies are, and Arya was gentle but willing to say "stop" if Phoenix got too annoying.



Phoenix was fascinated with my cat and, after a few chases, they interacted very nicely. Phoenix did well in her puppy class, although I was a little concerned about how intensely focused she was when playing with other puppies.

A problem really started in an agility foundations class at about 9 months of age. Phoenix was set up to take a couple of jumps when a Corgi started bouncing and growling behind her. Without any warning she spun and shot under the barrier at the Corgi.

The Corgi's owner picked him up so Phoenix never made contact, but she tried very hard until she was pulled away. She started lunging and growl/barking at new dogs in her environment, especially those that had high energy or made eye contact. She even tried to pull away to get to moving cars that she could see on a road four miles away.

I put her in a "Focus in Motion" class designed to help reactive dogs learn to focus on their task while other dogs do theirs. About half-way through the class, she got away from the person holding her in preparation for a recall, shot under a barrier and had a Westie down by the throat until she was pulled off. No blood drawn, but obviously frightening for the Westie and his owner. The journey was officially on.

I consulted several veterinary behaviorists and, in addition to a few behavioral modifications, I started Phoenix on fluoxetine, often called puppy Prozac, to slow her initial response to other dogs. By this point she was in beginner agility and obedience classes and the instructors asked that all other dogs be out of site while Phoenix was working.

It took a while to see an effect, and the effect was subtle. She was just as active and playful, but I could see a delay in her reactions to other dogs, and I had a chance to intervene with distraction and

reward for focus on me. It gave me time to build her recalls. She seemed to be more comfortable with dogs that she knew. It was not perfect. She chased one border collie-cross in an agility class, but once it reached its owner and stopped moving she turned and came back to me.

The most definitive improvement came with herding. I had introduced her to sheep at about a year. She clearly had strong herding instincts, but I wasn't sure that letting her push around animals that were five to 10 times her size was a good idea.

Plus, she was too fast for me. However, about four months later, the person that I trained with, Kim Schneider, offered some free private lessons with a guest instructor, Terry Wilmuth. I couldn't pass that up, so we gave it a try.

I told Terry about her reactivity, but he said to let her go with his big male Aussie, Mule. True to form, she went into silent attack mode. Mule turned his back, and she got a mouth full of hair from one butt cheek. Mule turned the other cheek, so to speak, and she got a mouthful of hair from the other side. Then she relaxed.

We were able to walk down the path to the sheep side by side. She had several great sessions of herding and even worked the sheep with Mule! I was astounded and elated! Herding was back in my plans.

Since that time we have spent a lot of time at Kim's farm for herding. Initially, I had to be very careful when dogs walked by because Phoenix would react, but gradually she started to ignore the dogs that she knew. She even became very friendly with a big male Samoyed, and they can walk and work sheep together without any reaction.

The journey is not over and never will be. I will always have to be careful with her and be thoughtful about the situations that I put her in. But the progress is real and she has taken many

great strides. I added a new male Bernese Mountain Dog puppy to the house when Phoenix was 16 months old, and they are great together, in part because the Berner takes no offense when Phoenix gets a little out of hand.

She has come along well in agility, obedience and herding. COVID-19 and my own health problems have slowed our progress and required that she learn distance in agility to complete a course. I was able to do a couple of trial runs with and without toys in the ring in February to see how she would handle that setting.

As long as the person running after me kept their dog back until we had run and I had her on leash, we were okay. Phoenix even got a few Qs in AKC Novice agility. She has her Started title in herding with my trainer handling her and is learning to drive sheep for the next level. She has been introduced to ducks and, while she does not understand why they won't fetch, she does not show any indication of aggression.

Phoenix is 3.5 years old now and has been off of Fluoxetine for over a year. When COVID is under control, she will be ready to compete in agility and obedience. She is fun to train (unless she is barking at me) and is very quick to learn. I have been teaching veterinary classes online for most of the year and she is my constant lap co-instructor.

To balance her aggression toward dogs, she loves people and has hopped up on laps and washed a few faces of people sitting in the agility ring. I have learned so much from her, even though some were not things that I expected.

So, if I could sum up my experience with Phoenix, "Be careful of what you wish for...and enjoy what you get!"

Many thanks to breeders and trainers that have helped us so much on our journey, including Ginny Hayes (breeder), Annelise Allan (Agility), Patty Fulton (Obedience), Kim Schneider (Herding), and especially Terry Wilmuth, who helped me see some light ahead.

In case you were wondering...I (Debbie) asked the AKC about registering a litter of pups born in Canada if both parents are AKC registered (and the breed is not currently recognized in Canada). Here was their answer:

Yes you are allowed to register the litter from Canada with AKC for this situation as long as both mom and dad are AKC registered. Thank you

The day before Thanksgiving, Momma and I arrived at the Fairgrounds in Perry, GA. Wow that place was big, lots of dogs, people, RV's and lots and lots of grass to run around on. We walked all over the place, through the buildings, around the outside, looking for rings and Fast CAT, (mom is terrible at directions). Mom bought me a new show lead and treats. I could tell we were going to have fun. We found Julie getting her picture taking at one of the show buildings and then went to find Marilyn and Ginger. We visited with everyone because we had already missed their class that morning and then



we were off to find Fast CAT.

Fast CAT was out in the middle of this field outside the show grounds. Mom got lost and we drove in circles (she gets lost a lot). First we found CAT, Coursing Aptitude Test, and this nice man explained that CAT was a pass or fail contest to chase lures 600 yards around a field and Fast CAT is like a 100 yard dash. Momma thought I would do better at the 100 yard dash because I'm such a velcro dog (Please don't tell my friends). Mom filled out the paperwork and we got in line to sign in. Dogs are required to check in too so they can be evaluated for lameness and females may not be in heat. We are

standing in line and all the sudden the lure (white puffy thing) went flying by and I knew this was going to be fun as I lunged at it. While we were in line Momma met Mary Helena (MH). MH offered to release me since it takes two humans to play this game. She told Mom there is always someone around to help release dogs for their owners.

When my name was called, MH was trying to hang on to me with all her might. I couldn't believe

Momma was walking away, leaving me with this woman. She got all the way to the other end of the orange fence and suddenly I was being taken into the fenced in area. I It took me a minute to see Momma way down at the end but when I did, I ran to her as fast as my legs would carry me. I yelled at her when I got down there for leaving me with a stranger. I scored 8.019 seconds that day. Friday, Ginger came with us, she and Echo sat in the front seat of our RV on the way over. The moment I saw the orange fence, I was so excited. When it was my turn, Ginger was supposed to release me, I wanted my Momma though, so a slipped out of my collar and I went to get her. Momma laughed as she handed me back to Ginger. This time I had a great run and finally figured out I was supposed to chase the lure. Friday our time was 7.831 seconds, pretty good for a rookie. Ginger joked with my momma that my time was probably faster



when I escaped the first time. Saturday morning, Julie and Huba did a Fast CAT run with us, this time

Huba got away from Momma and ran looking for Julie. I'm so glad I'm not the only escaping Pumi. Huba tried again and made it down the track to Julie. I ran like the wind and my time was 7.741 seconds. Sunday afternoon the weather was rainy but Momma and I went back for one last run in the afternoon. Julie and Huba came with us again. We had another great run 7.611 seconds and Huba beat her score from Saturday.

I really like Fast CAT. Momma says running is good for me. I get to stay in shape, chase lures, and have fun. Momma told me its more fun when you bring your friends because they get to have fun too. If you've never tried it, go do it. You just have to be at least 1 year old, thank goodness my first birthday was November 9th, and you have to be in good shape, and no ladies in heat because boys like me can't focus on anything else with you pretty ladies around. Next stop Ocala for more Fast CAT, Momma says when I reach 150 points, I get my BCAT but I just want to keep running because it is fun.

My Journey to the Pumi

I have owned collies for 30 years and shown them in herding, obedience and conformation since the mid 1990's however, my first love is agility. I started training in 1996 with my first collie, Arthur, and began trialing with him in 1998. There weren't many trials back then, usually one per month and some months there were none. Most were outside on grass in parks, but we also had 2 indoor facilities we used in winter. My friend, Ginny Hayes was showing Giant Schnauzers and we often competed against each other in the 24" class. At one trial, our dogs even tied! This was before computerized scoring and the tie wasn't discovered until after the course had already been taken down. We couldn't have a run off, so we flipped a coin, Ginny's dog won.

In order to feed my agility addiction and broaden my skills, I wanted to run a smaller dog. I wanted to stay in the Herding Group if possible. I began looking for a dog that would measure into either the 12" or 16" class. I looked at several breeds including Shelties, Canaan Dog and Miniature American



Shepherd. I got to the point of committing to a male sheltie puppy from a local litter, the sale fell thru and turned out to be a blessing in disguise because not long after, Ginny showed up at an agility trial with a little gray Pumi, named Tocho that stopped me cold. I watched him run and couldn't believe what I saw. What breed was this, and why hadn't I ever seen one before? I was immediately smitten, not because of their cuteness but because of that DRIVE! I knew that day I had found the smaller breed for me. I approached Ginny and asked where she got that dog. She told me she had a bitch she was going to breed to him to and was planning a breeding when her bitch came in season. I asked her to please put me on her list for a male, hoping the breeding would take and there would be one like Tocho in the litter.

The litter arrived on January 23, 2015. There were 9 puppies; 7 girls and 2 boys. Ginny wanted to keep a girl and I could have first pick of the boys. My son and I visited the litter around 5 weeks, and I focused on the 2 boys. I liked them both, this was going to be tough. Things changed and another puppy buyer talked Ginny out of the girl she wanted to keep, so Ginny decided to keep one of the boys. Sometimes things just work out though, I got my little Tocho (Binx) and Ginny kept the other boy (Ukko) AND her pick bitch ended up coming back to her! Everybody wins! The litter was quickly registered

with AKC so there would be enough to meet the minimum number of dogs needed for the breed to be incorporated into AKC. Coming from the second oldest breed in AKC, with a long history and large gene pool, it was exciting to be a part of a new and upcoming breed in the United States.

Binx came to me at a time when I was running my smooth collie, Guinness in agility nearly every weekend. Guinness was the time the #1 collie in agility at the time and I am proud to have earned with him the first MACH awarded at the first HPCA agility trial. However, I knew Binx was going to require a different way of training. Unlike what I had done with my collies, Binx required me to handle completely different and forced me to re-learn most of the things I had been successful with my collies. That said, Binx

runs like a big dog and actually has a longer stride than Guinness. I didn't realize this until I ran

both dogs on the same course. Guinness was slower but extremely efficient, turns tightly and rarely has a wasted step on a course. Binx runs fast, turns wide with too much extra yardage and little margin for error. Binx runs mainly in extension, whereas Guinness ran mainly in collection.

I was reluctant to begin trialing with Binx, mostly because I felt I wasn't ready, so my girlfriend and fellow agility addict and travel partner, agreed to go with me to an out of state trial. I knew the judge and knew she would be kind to us. Our first run was Novice Standard. I remember getting about halfway through the course and thinking "holy cow, he is doing all the obstacles" I was waiting for him to run around obstacles and even out of the ring,

but he never did and to my surprise we qualified with a score of 90.

The time came for Guinness to retire. I moved him from standard to preferred as he didn't need to be jumping 24" at 10 years old. It was becoming increasingly difficult for me to mentally switch from

running a slow and steady 24" dog to a high energy 16" dog and I wasn't doing a good job with either. As hard as it was to retire Guinness, it was time to focus on Binx. Years earlier, one of my instructors told me to retire the collie I was running at the time to focus on young Guinness. It was really hard to do but it was the right thing and I knew Binx needed to become my focus if we were ever going to have success. That success paid off at the agility trial at Pumi Fest 2019 where we won Agility High in Trial. I am still not sure how we accomplished this as I had pneumonia and was sitting on the sideline sucking on an inhaler, trying to get enough air in my lungs to be able to run.

It took some time for me to get used to the Pumi energy level. I did a lot of impulse control training with him as a puppy. I have told Ginny more than once; had she placed Binx in a pet home, she would have gotten him back. He is very pushy and too much drive for most people. He fits in really well with the collies though, they are a great combination and I can't imagine my life without either.

New Pedigree Database

I have been researching pedigree databases used all over the world for the last 2-1/2 years (in between other projects), looking for the ideal tool to be used for the Pumi worldwide. The primary criteria was that it should reside on the web and be accessible to anyone. After searching for pedigree software used by every single AKC breed (sometimes multiple databases in a breed, I evaluated the top 6 software packages using a weighted, scaled formula. The software that came out on top was called Pedigree Database Online based in the The Netherlands. I recommended to the HPCA Board of Directors that we purchase a license for this software at €300 per year and the Board agreed.

This is a very solid piece of software with many more functions than other software. For those who have been using Pedigree Online, that was a stopgap measure for us so that we didn't lose any of the information we had on American Pumik. I am in the process of assuring that all the dogs entered in Pedigree Online will be in this new system.


My vision of this software is that it will be <u>the</u> source for all Pumi information for breeders and owners worldwide, with authorized people adding data for their own dogs and with data managers in each country who review and approved added or changed information so that we keep the integrity of the data in the system.

Since this software is based in the European Union (EU), we must adhere to the EU's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) which is more strict than in the US. What it means is that we cannot display owner or breeder information without that person's permission. This will complicate things a bit as we're not used to having to ask for permission and I haven't figured out yet what we do for someone who's long dead. I am working with the software company to figure out some of this info.

What Does It Do?

Let's step through some of the screens so you can see what it provides. Below is the home screen that you can access at <u>https://pumi.pedigreedatabaseonline.com</u>.

From here you can see that you can:

- search for a dog
- see a listing of stud dogs
- set up a trial mating
- see a list of breeders
- sign up to get a logon

Also on the lower right is a random list of dogs, breeders, and stud dogs.

Search for a Dog

It does a "contains" search so that if you search for "bodri" for example, it will show you all the dogs that have "bodri" anywhere in their name:



It also shows you some information about the dog (registration number, DOB, color, etc) so you can make sure you choose the right dog. You can also search by registration number, DOB, or color, and sort by name or DOB. Or you can click on one of the letters of the alphabet and it will list all the dogs whose name starts with that letter.

There's an **advanced search** where you can search for just about any attribute that dog has. More on that at a later date.

Dog Information

If you click on a dog's name, it will show you the dog's record:



These fields are customizable so I've set it up to store color fields in addition to health tests. For many fields, if there's no data in the field, it doesn't show at all. For example, in addition to *Country of Origin*, there's *Resident Country* that indicates where the dog is living. All the fields are listed below.

In the future we can add more fields as we need. Dogs that are not living in the country where they were born will have 2 registration numbers, so the Reg. No. field has the one where they're living and the Other Registration No. field is their previous number. If the dog is still in the country where it was born, there's no need to fill in the Resident Country field.

This is on the same screen as the dog's info, and just below it.


The default is 5 generation pedigree but it wouldn't fit well on a page. The choice are from 3 – 7 generations. The cool thing is that dogs that show up more than once in a pedigree are color coded so you can see where duplicates occur. You can also control how much additional information is shown or whether you want to have the photos show.

The system creates a PDF file in 4 different formats so you can share or print a pedigree.

pdf style

This will generate a pdf. Depending on your browser-settings this will show up in a new tab or it will be in your downloadsfolder (Ctrl+J (Windows, Linux, and Chrome OS) and #-Shift-J (Mac)). You can view or print it with a pdf-reader. Here you can choose the type of pedigree and choose what options you want to show. Sometimes with long names or titles not all text will fit in the available space.






If you click on the kennel, it will shown you all their dogs:

You'll note that most of the dogs are mine because I added all my dogs in order to learn the system. Please feel free to enter your own dogs!

The Dogs in the Database

There's so much that this system can do, but I've taken up enough newsletter space as it is. We started with 5,000+ dogs from a spreadsheet given to me a number of years ago from Tamara Langer in

Hungary. She's done a tremendous amount of research on the history of the breed and is my resource for questions about the dogs. She also does the **Online Pumitár** website with historical information and photos of dogs at http://pumitar.hu/keptar-kepek-c.htm. She will be helping with this project, too. Then I added information from US dogs that I've compiled myself (hence all the Abiqua dogs are there). Right now I'm working to make sure every dog from the Pedigree Online database is also in this one, so we don't lose anything. I'm using the Swedish, Finnish, Estonian, and Italian online databases to add dogs of interest, and the AKC title reports, too. (However, dogs' titles may not be in there or be up to date.) The system allows you to add an entire litter at once, so that's very helpful. I also still need to go through a list of duplicate dogs and duplicate registration numbers that are supplied by this database.

If you're interested in adding your own dogs to this worldwide database, please contact me or sign up as a breeder. Or if you'd like me to enter your dogs, I'd be happy to do that, too. But I think you'll find that your dogs may already be in there. In that case, feel free to update their health or title info, or anything else that's missing or out of date.


