HPCA Versatility Program: An Overview

The HPCA Versatility Program recognizes the inherent versatility of the Pumi and has created an award for those dogs that participate and achieve certificates/titles in various types of competition, including conformation, herding, obedience, agility, tracking, and other dog sports and activities in a total of 16 different categories. Non-AKC certificates/titles can count towards this HPCA title. The program is open to Hungarian Pumi Club of America members who are in good standing with the club. Members can download the application form in the members-only section of this website. There are 4 levels of versatility awards:

VP1 (Versatile Pumi Level 1):

Requires at least 7 Versatility Points from at least 3 of categories 1-17.

VP2 (Versatile Pumi Level 2):

requires at least 14 Versatility Points from at least 3 of the categories 1-17, including at least 1 Versatility Point in Herding; in lieu of Herding, at least one achievement should have a minimum of 2-point value.

VP3 (Versatile Pumi Level 3):

Requires at least 20 Versatility Points from at least 4 of the categories 1-17, including at least 1 Versatility Point in Herding; in lieu of Herding at least 2 achievements should have a minimum of 3-point value.

VP Gold (Versatile Pumi Gold):

Requires at least 25 Versatility Points from at least 4 of the categories 1-16, including at least 2 Versatility Points in Herding; in lieu of Herding at least 3 achievements should have a minimum of 4-point value.

To see the point values of the various titles in the 17 categories and to apply for the Versatility Award Certificate, download the application/points worksheet from the members only section of HPCA website:

NOTE: The Versatility Award Certificate worksheet was revised to reflect titles not specified in the previous version.

Conformation:

CH: 6 points, GCH: 8 points was revised to CH: 7 points, GCH and above: 8 points Rally:

Changed the point values to the titles, reflecting the titles added by AKC since the previous version of the worksheet.

Novice: 2 points, Intermediate: 3 points, Advanced: 4 points, Excellent: 5 points, Advanced Excellent (RAE): 6 points, Masters: 7 points, RACH: 8 points.

Why Not Barn Hunt?

We all know that Pumik are a medium sized, alert, intelligent, energetic, and agile Hungarian herding breed used to herd cattle, sheep, and swine. They are versatile stock dogs equally adept at gathering, driving, and keeping the stock within boundaries as directed by the shepherd. These traits are listed in the AKC Official Standard. They excel at many sports, Agility, Scent Work, Dock Diving, Obedience, Rally, Lure Coursing, Fast CAT, Herding, and even Musical Freestyle. So why not Barn Hunt? There are only about 28 Pumik listed as title holders according to the Barn Hunt Association (BHA) as of the writing of this article. I'm going to introduce the sport of Barn Hunt, the purpose of workshops and training sessions, the classes, and titles.

Barn Hunt is a relatively new sport and titles are recognized by the AKC even though it is not an AKC sport. It tests the dog's hunting ability, scent work skills, including differentiation, speed, agility, surefootedness, and teamwork with their handler. The rats that are used on the courses are pampered pets. They are bred and trained specifically to enjoy going into the cages and PVC tubes which are hidden in hay filled courses full of nooks and crannies perfect for hiding vermin. The PVC pipes are designed with breathing holes and there are stringent rules to keep them safe during trials and during training.

The best way to find out more about Barn Hunt is to attend a trial, sign up for a

workshop, and/or attend classes. Competitors at Barn Hunt trials are extremely welcoming, helpful, and will explain the basics. We are all newbies in the beginning. There are also videos you can watch of dogs hunting to get a sense of what is expected in each level. If you attend a class, your dog will be introduced to a rat in a small wire cage or clear tube. You can then encourage your dog to interact or play with the rat. Next, the rat in the wire cage or clear tube is hidden in the hay where you can again use praise and treats for finding the vermin. Finally, they are hidden in solid PVC tubes where the dogs must rely on their sense of smell and hearing to locate the rats. Some people enter their dogs into the Instinct Class first to test their dog's prey drive. This is also a good way to start. In the Instinct Class, you should walk your dog over to where the tubes are laid out and point to the one you think may have a rat based on their reaction. I want to stress the importance of understanding dogs who have never seen a rat may react with interest or disgust when first introduced. This is not unusual. Also, please read the rules, there is no bigger disappointment than getting a Non-Qualifying score (NQ) for something as simple as not removing the dog's collar and leash, or putting these items in the wrong place, like your pocket which is not allowed.

There are six classes. They are Instinct (RATI), Novice (RATN), Open (RATO), Senior (RATS), Master (RATM), and Champion (RATCh). Titling in the first level or A level requires 1 Q (Qualifying Score) for

Instinct, 3 Qs for Novice, Open, and Senior, and 5 Qs for Master. Once you have gotten your first title, you notify the secretary and can either move up to the B level in that class or move up to the next level A class. You also have the option to go down a level and enter B level classes. The difficulty of hiding spots, number of rats, size of course, complexity and length of the tunnel and the time allowed change in each level. The B level classes require 10 Qs for a title. In Instinct you only have to correctly find the rat in the allowed time. Whereas all other classes require your dog to climb on a hay bale, go through an 18-inch wide by 20-22-inch-high tunnel, and successfully find all the hidden rats in the allotted time. I have attached the Barn Hunt Guide to A and B Classes for clarification. There are also 2 non-regular classes. A Crazy 8 Class, which is a point based timed class and a Line Drive Class which I will review in a future article.

Speaking from experience, I can tell you that Pumik are great ratters. I have 2 Pumik currently competing. Jasper has his RATM title so far, and Gracelyn who recently started has her RATN title. Jasper can't wait to find the rats and constantly hunts for the scent, whereas Gracelyn has a very slow and methodical hunting style. Their indication or tell is vastly different too. While Jasper

enthusiastically bites and holds the tube, Gracelyn either gently paws at the hay or stops and looks at me. Both dogs are excited to walk in the ring and start hunting. Somehow, there is a general belief that dogs do not need training to build motivation to hunt rats and that belief is entirely false. You do not hear that type of reasoning when talking to enthusiasts about training for obedience, agility, scent work or any other dog sport. Now that you know a little bit more about Barn Hunt workshops, classes, and titles, I certainly hope you get out there and there and try this great sport. Happy Ratting!!!

Barn Hunt® Guide to A and B Classes



Beginning in the summer and fall of 2018, the Barn Hunt Association will start implementing B classes and a new titling track. These changes affect only the Regular classes of Novice, Open, Senior, and Master. The changes were made to give teams an opportunity to stay at a single level or move down to a previous level while also giving them an opportunity to achieve new titles at that level. Here is what you need to know about the new B classes.


- All dogs, regardless of handler experience, start in A class at each level and stay in A class until the dog attains the title at that level.
- Once a dog finishes a title from A class, that dog may either move UP to the A class at the next level, LAT-ERALLY into the B class at the same level, or DOWN to any previous level they are eligible to enter.
- In B classes, X titles are awarded after 10 qualifying scores. 10 qualifying scores in Novice B will be RATNX, 20 scores will be RATNX2, etc.
- There will be one set of placements for all competitors in each B class level, regardless of height.
- A dog may show in any class that dog is eligible for. So a dog with a Master title may move DOWN and show in Novice B, Open B, or Senior B.
- Dogs are not required to finish a particular B class title to move on from that class. A dog may have multiple qualifying scores from different levels and may choose to enter different B class levels at different events.

 Dogs are never required to enter any lower level B classes, but must enter Master B to attain the titles of RATCH, RATCHX, and above.

For each Event:

- All dogs must be entered in only one class level and type. (i.e., a dog cannot be entered in Novice B on one day and Open A on the next.)
- Dogs entered in B class must stay in that class for the entire event (may not move up or down during an Event.)
- Dogs maybe entered in one B class level one weekend and a different one the next. As an example, a dog with a RATM title could enter Master B on one weekend, then Open B the next, up to Senior B, then back to Master, etc.
- All existing Master scores and titles are grandfathered in to the B classes.

TITLE PROGRESSION CHART



In the chart above, the A classes are listed on the far left. Next are the Qs needed to get the title at that level. Once you have the title the solid arrows show you where you can go next. For example, once you have your RATS title (gold box), you can follow the solid gold arrows to see that you can next enter either Master A, Senior B, Open B, or Novice B. Each X title takes 10 qualifying scores.

Grooming (Trimming) to the Pumi Standard (Part 4: Ears)

This is the fourth in a series of articles on grooming the Pumi to conform with the AKC Pumi Standard. This part deals with the ears. The Pumi head and ears is probably the most difficult to do for a new owner (or a professional groomer) because it's not like any other breed.

The standard says:

Ears are set on high, of medium size, and carried two-thirds erect with the tips pointing somewhat towards the sides. The ears are covered with hair, enhancing their whimsical expression. The ears are mobile and alert, moving quickly in reaction to any stimulation. *Disqualifications: Ears prick or hanging*.

The most important words are:

- Set on high
- Medium size, carried two-thirds erect
- Tips pointing somewhat towards the sides

* Set on High

Pumi ears should be about 2" apart at the top of the skull and hair will make them appear even closer together. The photos below show ideal ears. The photo on the left without hair and on the right with hair. When trimming you want to make the ears appear high-set and you can do that in three ways:

1. Leave a bit of extra hair on the inside edges of the ear

- 2. Trim off excess hair from the outside edges of the ear
- 3. Trim the top of the head between the ears fairly short (we discussed this in Part 3 on the head)

Here's a low-set ear for comparison. It's not been groomed to try to minimize the low-set ears. You can make vast improvements to this look!

* Medium size, carried two-thirds erect

It might be easier to think of the Pumi ear as "one third tipped" rather than "two thirds erect" because the one-third part is what we're most concerned with. (Note: when the AKC Pumi standard was written, we copied the wording from the Sheltie standard which says "carried three fourths erect" so the AKC judges would be familiar with the wording, even though the amount of the tip is different).



The first two photos above show Pumik with beautiful ears. Notice that there's not an actual fold in the ear – it's a rolling of the ear leather with the tips pointing forward (and to the sides a bit) rather than down, like a Fox Terrier. Because of this, you can't really measure the "one third" exactly. A good measure of thumb however, is that with an ear folded less than half, you should be able to see the inside of the ear from the front, in other words, the tip of the ear doesn't cover up the rest of the ear.

So, why do people leave lots of hair on the ear? To hold down ears that would otherwise be erect! But there's no need to leave lots of hair on a Pumi with good ears.

Take the next two "before" and "after" photos as an example. This is the same dog with too much hair on the left and properly trimmed ear hair on the right. The photo on the left shows the hair covering up the inside of the ear and they look like a half fold.





Now that you've got the idea, here is the diagram I use for trimming a Pumi that already has good ears. While the ear leather itself is somewhat pointed, the hair is cut in more of a circle around the ear. Notice that the hair at the tip of the ears is <u>very short</u> so when it folds over, it still looks like it's 1/3 tipped. Also notice that the sides of the ears at the base are fairly close, as is the inside edge of the ear.



If you leave longer hair at the tip, it would make the ear look like it was folded over more than one third, as below.




* Tips pointing somewhat towards the sides

Almost all Pumi ears tip to the sides, so you'll probably never have to worry about that!



The Back of the Ears



Once the sides of the ears have been trimmed, then trim the back of the ears by straightening out the ear and tapering the length of the hair from long at the tip (more weight) to short at the base. The base of the ear was discussed in Part 3 on head, but here is a repeat diagram.




Corrective Grooming

You can't control the size of your Pumi's ears, but it helps to determine how the ear folds and you can compensate by how long you leave the hair on the ears. If your Pumi's ears are 1/4 tipped, you would follow the second diagram to leave more hair on the ear tips to make it appear to be 1/3rd. If they're erect, with enough hair (weight), you may even be able to get them to tip!

If the ears are low set, take as much weight off the ears as you can, and cut the top of the skull as close as practical to give the illusion of lift to the ears. Leave more hair on the inside edges of the ears to make them appear closer together.

The First Trim

Yikes! How much do you trim on the ears????

This is a case where you take it easy and trim a little bit at a time to see where the ear is going to fold when the weight of the hair is removed from it. Trim the tip straight across and see what happens. If the ear stays tipped a lot, trim some more off (straight across again). Keep trimming until you can see the ear folding at one third. Then start on the other ear and hope you can match it. Next, round off the sides as in the diagrams above.

If the ears still fold over too much, don't give up hope. Once they've had the weight removed, they may still go higher. Here's a young dog in the middle of his first ear trim, then a year later.

Meet the Breed NYC 2024


It is an event like no other. Ticket sales before the doors opened were up 20% from 2023 so attendance topped 30,000 people to meet the numerous breeds of dogs. There were a few moments that the Pumik were overwhelmed. The pictures tell it all. Special thanks to Dina Bochnik Cooper, Andrew Cooper, and JoAnn Molnar-Kieffer for all their help.

I am sometimes questioned about why we do this – we meet a lot of people interested in the breed. They may not be a future Pumi owner, but a few are. We answer that they are NOT a poodle and..... a thousand times we say, "They are a Hungarian herding dog bred to herd cattle, sheep, and pigs." And all of the visitors are interested.

Once in a while we even get someone who goes a bit overboard with Pumik after meeting their first one at the NYC event.... HUM, do I know any of those people? YES! Me! I

met my first Pumi at the NYC Meet the Breeds. ZsaZsa thinks that was a very good thing.







Therapy Dogs (Part 1): An Introduction and ZsaZsa Expertise

This is the first in a series of articles about therapy dogs. This article will cover therapy dog terminology, the purpose, some variations between therapy dog organizations, and Fuji's interview with ZsaZsa. The next issue will cover Pumi specific considerations, Fuji's first year working as a therapy dog, some unexpected benefits for Fuji that have transferred to activities beyond therapy work, and AKC Therapy Dog titles and requirements. An important distinction is that therapy dogs are different than service dogs and according to Alliance for Therapy Dogs (ATD, 2024), "...they provide a therapeutic benefit to the general public. They are not service dogs and, as such, they are not eligible for public access rights" (p. 19). Dogs are only eligible to these benefits if they are a registered service dog who is performing work for their disabled handler.

Serpell and colleagues (2020) estimate that there are far more than the 180 therapy dog organizations recognized by AKC and amongst these organizations there is not a unified national standard for therapy dog training, evaluation, health screenings, and policies. Animal Assisted Activities (AAA) and Animal Assisted Therapy (AAT) do not have clearly defined national standards, as Bert and colleagues (2016) found in their literature review of 36 articles. Animal Assisted Interventions (AAI) is an umbrella term for AAA, AAT, and Animal Assisted Education (AAE) (AAAIP, 2022).

How I have understood the difference between AAA and AAT aligns with the general distinctions found by Bert and colleagues (2016). AAA are visits by a therapy animal with the aim of comfort care but without a specific treatment goal and without the need for a licensed professional. Dogs can work in both capacities (and potentially other species) while cats generally perform AAA since they are usually not trainable for AAT. I have a cat who provided snuggling and received pets from two elderly women living in memory care units for 4 years until they both passed away in 2018. Be aware that you should not publish photos without understanding the consent waivers and rules for the organization you are registered with. When our friends moved to a nursing home that did not have a contract with HABIC (the organization Bindu was registered with) we continued to visit them with the approval of the facility, and I had gotten to know both of their families and I would send them photos of their visits.

Both Fuji (Pumi) and my retired therapy dog, Tatanka (Spanish Water Dog), have provided AAA in nursing and assisted living facilities and AAT for a local mental health organization where a social worker sets treatment goals for their adolescent patients in canine assisted group therapy. AAA is also performed in reading programs, hospital visits, university and school wellness days and finals week events, among others. AAT can also be performed through work with occupational

therapists, psychologists, and other licensed professionals who employ teams to work with patients towards treatment goals. Check out the next issue for what treatment goals can look like.

Bert and colleagues' (2016) literature review found decreases in depression and anxiety for diverse populations working with therapy dog teams. Some of the research has indicated a reduction in patient pain levels such as with hospitalized children and with post-operative orthopedic patients, and decreased blood pressure, heart rate, and respiratory rates (not all research found differences

between the control (no treatment group) and those receiving AAI) (Bert et al., 2016). AAI is not without risk and there is

concern from researchers about the lack of consensus between animal therapy organizations particularly safeguards against zoonotic diseases (things like parasites that can be transmitted between animals and people) and behavioral risks such as bites, scratches, and knocking people over (Bert et al., 2016; Serpell et al., 2020).

Serpell and colleagues (2020) compared national, state, and regional animal therapy organizations, on aspects such as training for handlers and dogs, health and safety practices for humans and animals, guidelines for handlers, and liability insurance requirements. Since my dogs have only been registered with Alliance for Therapy Dogs (ATD) and my cat was registered with Human-Animan Bond in Colorado (HABIC), I was not aware of some organization variations for things such as required spay/neuter, required year-round flea and tick treatment, Canine Good Citizen requirements, and stated guidelines around prohibition of raw food and treats. Some areas of consensus, such as a current rabies vaccination are not surprising. If you decide to pursue therapy dog registration it would be worthwhile to read this

article (https://doi.org/10.3389/fvets.2020.00035 - free and available online) to determine what questions you need to ask when choosing an organization.

An item that is important to me but that wasn't considered in Serpell and colleagues' (2020) research was whether the animal therapy organization charges facilities for visiting teams. ATD does not charge facilities, however, I stopped volunteering with HABIC because they did not disclose to me that they were charging the nursing home a sizable monthly fee for the volunteer work I was doing with my cat while also requesting annual donations which I assumed was to cover liability insurance. Only to find out a year in, from the nursing home activities coordinator, about the charges. Some organizations require teams to pay for training classes through them, while others do not require classes. Evaluations should be required for all teams before working with the public. If you have done extensive training prior to pursuing registration you could go with an organization like ATD who doesn't require formal classes with their organization, however, if you and your dog could benefit from formal classes seeking an organization with built in training classes could be to your benefit.

Fuji and I met with Nancy Nelson and ZsaZsa on March 23, 2023, over Zoom, to talk about their therapy dog experience as Fuji was embarking on his first year of work. ZsaZsa shared that she chose to become certified with Therapy Dog International (TDI) because she liked the fashion – especially the fancy bandana. Her primary work over the last 8-years has been helping Kindergarteners in reading programs with groups of 5-6 children who read books to ZsaZsa and she has been able to integrate her passion for fashion by bringing multiple bandanas for wardrobe changes between

readers. She has also provided her therapy services to elderly homebound individuals through assignments from the Department of Social Services, but nursing and assisted living homes aren't her jam. ZsaZsa has also done final exam week visits with students and once worked with special needs kids.

ZsaZsa told Fuji that "Being a Pumi, therapy dog work can be tough when you're young, because we Pumi tend to be a bit shyer before we've matured a bit – like my sister Heidi would be a terrible therapy dog because she doesn't like people to touch her until she is comfortable with them, and my brother Dragon is now almost 6 and can do Meet the Breeds and be happy about it, but he wouldn't let people touch him for a long time." ZsaZsa thinks it's part individual personality and partly the amount of socializing time she got compared to Heidi and Dragon, especially Heidi who came from Hungary at 6-months old during COVID – but she's come a long way, just not therapy dog level of friendly.

Nancy suggested that we look at the Trick Dog skills list for ideas on what the kids could teach Fuji in group therapy and then he'd be ready for Trick Dog titles. ZsaZsa's advice to Pumik who want to become a therapy dog is, "Work with people – you need to get willing to work with people and meet and greet. My favorite place is going to the mall to meet people because I can do some shopping and you can practice riding an elevator at the mall because they can be scary at first. Going to restaurants is a good spot too and you might get a tasty morsel." Hear that Pumik! Get out. Get out early in life. And socialize with those people so they don't seem so odd. And for you humans – when asking Nancy why she wanted to have a therapy dog she said "I thought it would be a good way to give back. And whatever you do in life, somebody gave to you to be able to become what you are, and you have an obligation in your life to give back too, in another way. It doesn't have to be the same way, but you have an obligation to give back. You've got to pass that gift on and whatever kindness you give you get back in ten-folds."

Maybe you have a Therapy Pumi in the making? Or a Pumi in your future who you'd like to set a solid foundation for to develop their therapy work potential? Stay tuned for the Spring 2024 HPCA Newsletter.

Changes were made to the following Articles of the by-laws for clarity and to reflect current practices:

Article XIII, Section 2 Article XIII, Section 7 Article XXIV, Section 1

To the Rules applying to Dog Shows (the following changes were approved):

Chapter 11, Section 13 - removes reference to sweepstakes and futurity judges as the restrictions have historically been defined by Board policy.

Chapter 16, Section 1:

The option to offer a 3-point major for a Reserve Winner at a specialty show. The offering of the 3-point Reserve Winner major is at the option of the national club.

Chapter 14, Section 29 of the Field Trial Rules and Std. Procedure for Pointing Breeds: Removed requirement for a club to hold a horseback championship.

Proposed Amendments – to be voted on at the March 2024 meeting:

Chapter 12, Section 1 and Section 4

Deletes the requirement to publish the complete address for the judges, replacing with city and state. It also deletes the requirement to publish the address of all exhibitors replacing with city, state, and email, if provided. Removing the requirement to publish the full address of the owner in the show catalog.

Chapter 3, Section 1 and Section 3 of the Beagle Field Trial Rule

Chapter 4, Section 1 and Section 3 of the Beagle Field Trial Rules

Chapter 9 Section 5 of the Beagle Field Trial Rules

Chapter 9 Section 6 of the Beagle Field Trial Rules

Removes unnecessary restrictions when hosting trials

Conformation Issues

Groups/Assignment of Breeds:

Authority resides with the Delegate body currently.

The Parent Club Committee requested that the AKC Board change this rule to move the authority to the Board. The request was denied as the board felt that this was not within the purview of the Parent Club Committee and the request should be sent to the Dog Show Rules Committee for their consideration.

Expansion of Local Specialty Club Territories:

The AKC board has voted to permit expansion of an existing local special club within the following parameters:

- 1) Club membership changes and/or event site changes warrant the need for expansion.
- 2) Expansion may include statewide or communities in multiple states if necessary to meet the minimum of 12 local households required so long as it doesn't infringe on another local special club's territory.
- As with all territory expansion requests AKC reserves the right to adjust club territories by reducing a territory should the breed become more popular in the future and another club in the area is justified.

Conflict Distance Policy

Current show conflict distance policy imposes a 500-mile limit on local specialty clubs when participating with the National Specialty. This restriction was removed.
